Ten easy steps to becoming a 4-H Leader!

- Get in touch with the Hunterdon County 4-H Agent or 4-H Program Assistant
- 2. Fill out the application form and participate in a leader training
- 3. Recruit members (at least five)
- 4. Select a topic for your club
- Select a meeting place, either your home, a church, local school, or the Hunterdon County Extension Center.
- 6. Select a name for your club.
- Hold a business meeting at least once a month which would include pledges, business meeting, educational program and recreation
- 8. Elect officers for your club
- Get your parents interested and involved
- Plan a calendar, which includes meeting dates, activities, field trips, "hands on" activities and recreation.
