

Protection of Minors renewal and background checks for all volunteers Including Club Leaders and Shooting Sports Instructors

Attention, all appointed volunteers (including leaders and shooting sports instructors) you must complete the 40 minute 4-H Protection of Minors (POM) Refresher Course in order to fulfill your annual POM training requirement, please log into https://pom.ipo.rutgers.edu. Please do this immediately regardless of the date you last completed. The state office would like to have all volunteers to complete this in September 2023, even if a year has not passed since you last completed it.

If meeting indoors, please pay careful attention to the meeting room reminders below. All clubs meeting in the Extension Center will need to sign the meeting room rules prior to booking for the new year.





Meeting Room Reminders

When booking rooms, you will need to fill out a request form as well as room agreement form.

There is a blue cleaning carryall in each room that contains a limited supply of wipes to be used to disinfect tables, doorknobs, etc. The bin also contains some precut plastic table covers and tablecloth kits.

All meeting room usage must comply with Rutgers Cooperative Extension guidelines and recommendations as well as any county rules. There are brown tables in each meeting room...make sure you know how they operate (latch/unlatch). All tables in Room 2 should be put away after each use. In Room 1, one tables can be left up in the front of the room and the rest should be put back in the way they were found in the craft area.

All 4-H crafts and activities MUST use the plastic folding tables in Room 1. PLEASE do not use the brown tables for any of your club activities.

If you are using markers during a business meeting, please cover the brown tables with the table cover supplied in the carryall box. After use please fold up the plastic and place back in the carryall. Please cleanup after your meeting, throw out garbage, pick up on the floor, and leave the room as you found it.

Please remember that your group must sign in/out on the clipboard next to the entrance door and complete a room use sheet. The completed room use sheet should be placed in the wooden box on the counter.

Online re-enrollment for all members, leaders and shooting sports instructors Enrollment for New Members - Began September 7th!

All 4-H members, volunteers and instructors need to reenroll for the 2023-24 4-H year. You may do so by logging onto 4-H Online https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in. Enter your family name and password and activate your family's registrations. Be sure to activate everyone in your household, as well as all clubs that your family is involved with. https://orc.participate in 4-H activities until they are re-enrolled and/or registered. Please note: Leaders must watch the training video that is now included in the re-enrollment process.

Club Leaders: Remember to have all of your new families register as well. New families will need to create a profile.

<u>Please make this a priority, new and current members will not be eligible to participate in the 2023-2024 year until they are registered.</u>

4-H Event Permission Form for Youth and 4-H Release Agreement Form for Adults

Many of you have questioned the permission forms that you are filling out on the Online Enrollment. Your members will still need to fill out a form every time they attend something outside of your regular 4-H meetings. Please make sure that you collect forms for events/activities/trips you do which are held outside your regular meeting sites. The forms should be carried to the event in case they are needed. At the end of each event, forms should be filed at the 4-H Office.

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Fall Paper Clover Campaign October 4-15, 2023

Club Scarecrow Contest Entries set-up September 25th - October 1st Everitt Farms at Pumpkin Junction

Hello to our friends and neighbors! Here at Everitt Farms we are keeping up our tradition of doing our annual 4-H scarecrow competition at our corn maze and pumpkin patch. Our guests love seeing the scarecrows every year, and are always impressed! We invite you to participate and have your club show their creativity! First, second and third place winners will be selected by a judge from Everitt Farms.

Competition Rules

- All entries must be family friendly. Everitt Farms at Pumpkin Junction is a family-oriented attraction! Scarecrows must be built on some type of wooden/plastic post that is sturdy. When you drop off your scarecrow, Everitt Farms will provide a metal T-Post secured in the ground at your display location for you to secure your scarecrow to. Please bring supplies such as zip ties or wire to secure your scarecrow to the T-Post. Your scarecrow must be weather resistant and sturdy as it will be out in the elements for a month. Everitt Farms is not responsible for any scarecrows on display.
- A sign should be posted on your scarecrow with your Club Name
- ◆ Scarecrows should be set up by September 29th. Contact Barri-Lynn for a different arrangement if necessary
- Winners will be announced at Achievement Night
- Scarecrows will need to be picked up Sunday, October 29th, by 5:00 PM. We will be running the combine through the fields at Everitt Farms starting on the 31st, so all scarecrows not picked up by then will be disposed of.

We encourage you to create a scarecrow that describes your group or club. Make it individual, make it you! Please email your group/club name, entry title, and a brief description on your entry so we may reserve a spot for you.








County Medal & Record Book Information

Record Book Judging Record Books due 4:00 PM Tuesday, October 10th



Record Book judging is quickly approaching, so be sure to stop by the 4-H Office or check out our website at https://hunterdon.njaes.rutgers.edu/4h/forms/ for the Record Book Guide, Criteria for Individual Projects, Club and Member in Good Standing criteria, Community Service and Leadership Suggestions, and the Record Book Score Sheet. Please use this as a guide for assembling your record book for judging.

Record Books need to be dropped off at the 4-H Office by 4:00 PM on Tuesday, October 10th. Late books will have 10 points deducted.

There are sections of your record book that need to be signed by leaders, parents and members. Please be sure to make a summary sheet for each year you are in 4-H, current project book and leader signature forms properly signed. If the pages are not properly signed the book will not be judged.

In order to be eligible for a county medal you will need to meet all the Member in Good Standing guidelines listed below.

4-H Member in Good Standing

As a 4-H member you should be a member in good standing. A member in good standing will be eligible to participate in the 4-H County Awards Program. Members are judged on these guidelines using a specific county medals score sheet (found in the County Medals Packet of Award Information). To be a member in good standing in Hunterdon County, members should:

- Participate in at least 70% of club meetings
- Participate in one County 4-H Presentation Contest throughout his/her 4-H career (more are recommended)
- Give one club presentation during current 4-H year
- Participate in one community service project (club/individual)
- Participate in county fair set-up/clean-up events (outside of project area)
- Participate in county show or fair exhibit
- Participate in club, county, or state fundraising
- Participate in three county events other than the County 4-H Fair



Special Teen Awards

The Hunterdon County 4-H Association gives special awards to teens at Achievement Night. Teens in 8th grade and above should stop by the 4-H Office to pick up the "Special Teen Awards" packet which explains each award, requirements, and information needed to apply. 4-H Club Merit Award

If your club follows the guidelines below, they will be entitled to receive a Club Merit Award. This award will be presented at Achievement Night. The Club in Good Standing Guidelines are as follows:

Hunterdon County 4-H Club in Good Standing Guidelines

There are many different kinds of 4-H Clubs. They meet at different times and have different projects and interests. However, there are some things that every 4-H club should have in common. The following are requirements for 4-H clubs and members. If your club meets all of these requirements, it is a 4-H club in good standing. Your club should:

- Have qualified 4-H leaders who have been screened and trained by our 4-H staff and who will attend at least four out of the six 4-H Association Meetings. The Association meets January, March, May, July, September and November.
- Hold at least one business meeting a month for nine or more months of the year.
- Elect officers annually to run club meetings.
- Have an approved constitution and club charter following all guidelines established by the IRS and National 4-H Council. This includes submitting a club financial plan and audit form by **March 1st** of each year. All club fundraising efforts should be registered with the 4-H Office at this time.
- Have at least five registered members from at least three families.
- Each club is required to actively participate in 4-H fundraising on either the county or state level.
- Each club is required to actively participate in 4-H fairground work details throughout the year by sending 1-3 club members to help out at each event (based on membership).
- Participate in at least one community service project. Service projects include animal exhibits, Earth Day, or one of your clubs choice.
- Each club member should participate in club presentations.
- Exhibit or demonstrate at the 4-H and Agricultural Fair.

Many of our 4-H clubs and members come to the 4-H Association for financial support for items for our fair and trips for their members. If your club is not a club in good standing and does not meet these guidelines, then the association has the right to deny your club funds, or in the worse case has the right to disband your club.

It's Story Time... 4-H Story

Members are only required to write one story for their Record Book, which should include all events, activities, learning experiences, and project-related information. The story should be written on your 2022-2023 Summary Sheet. Project record book stories are not required. Guidelines for what the judges will be looking for in your story can be found in the County Medals Guidelines.

The 4-H Association is sponsoring a "Best 4-H Story" contest. Rules and guidelines can be picked up at the 4-H Office. Your story should be written on the summary sheet for the 2022-23 4-H year. The best story award will be presented to a junior member (grades 4th - 7th) and a senior member (grades 8th - 13th) at the Achievement Night Program. Winners will be awarded a \$15.00 Tractor Supply gift card.

Best 4-H Camp Story Due Tuesday, October 10th

Did you have an awesome time at 4-H Summer Camp? Do you want to go to camp? Have you heard so many good things about Summer Camp that you would like to attend next year? If you have answered "yes" to any of these questions, then this "Best 4-H Camp" story contest is for you. Rules and guidelines can be picked up at the 4-H Office. Your story should be submitted by October 10th, neatly written, using correct grammar. The winner will receive a \$100.00 scholarship towards 2024 summer camp.
